large and on a rising scale of prices. After the sixes had improved nearly two points to 113, little sale for profits occurred and the quotation fell back a point. Prices hardened slowly again after midday. Purchases were extremely small. Operators were inclined to speculate in large amounts until something more definite was known about the outcome of the reorganization plan of the American Tobacco. The telephone stocks were bid up materially, American Telephone rising one and Pacific Telephone one and a half. American cotton oil fell one-half.

Attorney General Wickersham's statement accepting the American Tobacco plan, on condition that it be modified in accordance with his proposals, resulted in active buying of the securities of the company. The six per cent bonds rose to 113 5/8, a gain of 2 3/8 on heavy trading. The four advanced a point. The preferred stock rose 2 3/8 to 96 1/2. On the curb, the common stock jumped nearly 20 points. The close was strong.
