LEAF by leaf the roses fall. For a long time it was believed that Mr. Cleveland's assertion which however he failed to carry out, "public office is public trust" was original. But now the New York Sun points to the fact that the sentence appears on page 470 of the first volume of the "Cyclopedia of Political Science and Political Economy," published in 1882. In the future it will likely appear that even "innocent desuetude" was not original with Mr. Cleveland. And what will be left of his administration then?

The governor has sent in a special message, transmitting the reports of the auditor, of the treasurer, of the adjutant general, of the cattle sanitary board, the capital building committee and the territorial geologist. The governor calls attention to the very large cost, expenses; recommends that the certificates for militia service and supplies, incurred in 1885, amounting to \$52,000, be paid; calls attention to the action of the cattle sanitary commission; recommends the purchase of the records of the New Mexico volunteers from 1861 to 1865; calls attention to the necessity for an annual appropriation for the care and main-

tenance of the capitol building and minor matters. The message will be found in full in another column.

As it is plain to every fair minded citizen, that a better, fairer and more effective election law should be passed, we reproduce herewith the salient features of the Australian election law. It is believed that the Australian election law is the best as yet devised. Some of its features may be adopted for this territory with much benefit. The following are the principal features of the Australian law: All ballots are printed by the state and none are allowed to be peddled by any party.

They contain all the names of all the candidates printed in each ballot. The voting place has two rooms. In the first sit the returning officer, poll clerk, and a scrutineer for each candidate if he wishes to appoint one.

One voter is admitted to this room and approaches the returning officer, who holds all the ballots. He takes one and writes his initials in the corner.

Before giving it to the voter he asks three questions to which the voter must subscribe answers, viz: Have you already voted at any place in this election? Are you John Jones, No. 43, on the electoral roll?

Have you been influenced in any way or by any person to vote the way you now propose to vote?

Having subscribed the printed forms to these questions the voter passes into the private room, where he finds a table and red pencil. He now causes by scratching every name he does not wish to vote for, folds his ballot and returns it to the table, where there is a glass box into which he deposits and passes out.

When the ballots are counted all which have not the initials of the returning officer are rejected. In case a voter is blind a scrutineer is allowed to go with him and do the scratching by his direction.

The box has three locks. One key is kept by the returning officer, and one by the scrutineer of each party, and all three must agree to open the box. The returning officer is appointed by the government and is a non-partisan as far as can be.

Mr. ROLEY's bill, C. B. No. 25, establishing the fees of justices of the peace and constables and defining the duties of such officers, is a good bill and ought to pass. The duties of these officials can not be too carefully defined. In a great many instances, even right here in this county and at the territorial capital, justices of the peace heretofore have been genuine bosses and have acted just as they deemed fit, regardless of law, precedent, right or equity. This state of affairs should cease, and at once. If ignorant, vicious and bad men are elected to such important offices, the law must restrain their vicious tendencies. Mr. ROLEY's bill is a step in that direction. It ought to become law.
