A new cotton factory has been established in Charlotte.
Cleveland county is working up considerable interest in the tobacco business.
A company of Northern capitalists will establish a bucket and broom factory between Durham and Company Shops.
Mr. John H. Small has sold the Washington Gazette to Messrs. Winfield and Burgess.
The total cost of the Presbyterian Church and furniture at Davidson College is valued at \$6,318.
Hons. R. T. Bennett and Whorton Green and their families are at Seaside Park, near Wilmington.
Miss Mary McDonald of Raleigh is visiting her friend Miss Etta May Troy, at Asheville Junction.
The Lousburg Times is crowing big over the completion of the rail road to that place.
Lousburg is to have a tobacco warehouse 40x100.
There is quite a colony of South Carolinians spending the summer and settling in the neighborhood of Cedar Mountain.
Alexander McAdoo, a convict, died at the convict quarters at the Spartanburg Junction last night. He had been confined about four weeks with the fever.
From the Piedmont Press we learn that Catawba Court convenes to-day with Judge Shipp and Solicitor Osborne in charge.
Rev. J. W. Belk is teaching an interesting school at Old Fort.—About 200 names enrolled at the Boone Normal. It closes next Thursday, Aug. 3.—Over 200 visitors at Blowing Rock.—The first full car load of glass ever shipped over the W. N. R. R. stopped at Hickory last week.—Mr. C. T. Abernathy has discovered a very valuable mineral spring on his farm five miles from town. An analysis shows that the water contains alum and sulphur.—A man named Cotton from Knoxville and under assumed name telegraphed his own death to his wife and then left for parts unknown.

GALVESTON, TEX., August 1.—The appearance of a school of immense devil fish, never before seen in these waters, has, during the past two weeks, had the effect of nerveing the community toward their capture, or at least driving the monsters back to deep water. One of the fish was captured and weighs about four tons.
NASHVILLE, August 1.—August Vandrill, a German, aged 26, employed in building a stone pier for the new bridge, was knocked off the pier by the slipping of a rope and fell sixty feet into the river. When the body was recovered his skull was found to be mashed.
