CHOLERA IN PHILIPPINES.

Asiatic cholera first made its appearance in Manila on March 20, when two cases were discovered. The infection was brought no doubt from China, where the disease is very prevalent this year. Although steps were speedily taken to stamp out the disease it continued to spread among the natives and Chinese until it is estimated there has been fully 25,000 cases, and nearly as many deaths. Comparatively few Americans or Europeans are attacked by it, but it is almost impossible to enforce measures of sanitation among the natives and Chinese with whom the island is crowded. Thus far the disease has been confined to Luzon in the archipelago. The disease is of a deadly type this year and few recover from it. It has by no means run its course, and the island will probably be afflicted by it until December at least, and perhaps longer.

The archipelago has been rid of bubonic plague, and the 3000 cases of leprosy in the islands are under governmental observation, with a view to the suppression of the disease in the long run. Smallpox is under control, and thunderpest no longer afflicts the cattle of the islands. The sanitary task among such a horde of natives and Chinese, who have no respect for approved regulations, is a heavy one, but the board of health is doing good work, and no doubt it will after a while be able to free the archipelago from all alarming epidemics. It is one of the problems that Admiral Dewey bequeathed to us when he suddenly appeared in Manila harbor on a morning in May three years ago.

HOME OWNERS.

The census bureau shows that there are in this country 5,739,657 farms, worth \$20,514,000—a fabulous sum that is altogether incomprehensible. But one can at least grasp the fact that the number of farms is increasing faster proportionately than the population—that the size of the average farm is now 146 acres—that here at least is one element of national wealth that is free and unshackled.

This is emphatically a country of farms owned by the tillers of the soil. One American in thirteen owns a farm. Tenancy exists to some extent in the South, but the tendency is away from it, and time will give this section as many farm owners as any other section possesses. The departure from an old system calls for time, which will solve the problem in the right direction.

It is estimated that there are 9,154,000 home-owning heads of households in this country, as against 4,995,000 in France, the land of small proprietors. Germany has 5,002,300 home-owners, and the United Kingdom outside of London has but 1,173,794.

The United States readily outranks any other country in this important respect. It has now 10,000,000 of home-owners who thus have a direct and abiding stake in the country, giving it a stable and conservative citizenship. One in eight of all Americans own the land they live on or at least the home they live in, and tenancy is not a gaining proposition in this country, and it is not believed it ever will be. In the South it is losing ground daily and the sooner this section is rid of it the quicker it will become highly prosperous. Tenancy is everywhere a curse, and no country or section can rise to the height of its possibilities that shelters it. It was bequeathed to the South by events, and the changes of time will eradicate it.
