

SAPPHIRE MINES

Of Montana Produce Large Output of Gems Annually.

The Yogo sapphire mines in Fergus county, this state, are the most remarkable in the world, for the precious stones are found in regularly formed veins instead of in pockets and clusters.

So far the company has worked down only 50 or 60 feet, but prospecting has been done to a depth of 200 feet, and sapphires have been found all the way down.

Through the summer many gems are thrown aside as culls, but men are left at the mines through the winter to sort these culls. There would be no danger, however, in leaving the mines unguarded, for nature protects them, as, after the water freezes, it is impossible to extract the sapphires from their clay bed.

The mining company obtains water from a point 12 miles from the workings, conveying it through ditches and flumes. The supply this season has been smaller than usual, owing to the light snowfall last winter, but it was not necessary at any time to suspend operations.

The demand for the sapphires is constantly increasing and the supply is insufficient, despite the fact that many persons are engaged in mining them at various spots along the Missouri river. All the stones are shipped direct to London, where many of them are out, while others are sent to Antwerp for that purpose.

There is no indication that the mines are playing out. On the contrary, they seem to be getting richer. As a by-product, considerable corundum is being mined, but this will be valueless until a railroad is built to the mines.
