Obituary

The Nationalist, published at Clonmel, Ireland, in its issue of December 17, 1904, publishes the following obituary notice of Mrs. Margaret Ryan, mother of Mrs. D. Murphy of Globe, written by a correspondent:

"With feelings of regret, I have to chronicle the death of Mrs. Margaret Ryan, at the rather advanced age of 76 years. Deceased was ailing for a considerable time from an acute affection of the heart, from which she finally succumbed. She was remarkable in many ways for her good-natured and kind disposition. Towards the poor, she had ever an open and generous hand, and was loved and respected by all classes and creeds. Her remains were removed to Rossmore church, where solemn Requiem High Mass was chanted, and subsequently the funeral started for the family burial ground in Clonoulty. The following clergymen attended—The Rev. D. Canon Ryan, P.P., Rev. Father Tuohy, Rev. Father O'Kelly, Rev. Father Connery, Rev. F. Fahy, and Rev. F. O'Keefe. The funeral cortege was large and respectable, and bore ample testimony of the esteem in which deceased was held. The chief mourners were her children and grand children. The relatives, friends and the general public that paid a last tribute of respect at the graveside were altogether too numerous to mention. The funeral arrangements were carried out with the utmost satisfaction and regularity by Mr. Dargan of Cashel.—R.I.P. The family desire to acknowledge, with most sincere thanks, the messages of sympathy received from absent friends."
