## JOINT STATEHOOD IS DEFEATED BY SENATE

### Arizona's Autonomy Preserved—Foraker Amendment Adopted and Then Arizona and New Mexico Eliminated

Washington, D. C., March 10.—Friday afternoon at exactly 5:35 the senate passed the bill for the admission of a new state to be called Oklahoma and to be composed of the territories of Oklahoma and Indian Territory. It was the house joint statehood bill with all provisions relating to Arizona and New Mexico stricken out.

The motion to strike out was made by Mr. Burrows, and it was carried by the close vote of 37 to 36 after having been lost by the still closer vote of 35 to 36.

The vote on statehood came as a climax of a day devoted exclusively to that bill. Most of the time was given to discussion, but the voting on the bill and amendments consumed an hour and a half.

When promptly at 4 o'clock the gavel fell at the end of Mr. Beveridge's final appeal for the bill, the voting was begun.

### Foraker Amendment Adopted

As soon as the committee amendments were disposed of, Mr. Foraker formally offered his amendment providing for separate vote on joint statehood. The vote was immediately taken and carried by the decisive vote of 42 to 29, as follows:

### New Mexico and Arizona Cut Out

The proceedings up to this time had been in a committee of the whole. When the bill was reported to the senate Mr. Burrows renewed his motion to strike out the part of the bill relating to Arizona and New Mexico, and this time it prevailed, 37 to 35, as follows:

The changes from the first vote were Scott, who voted aye, and Overman, who transferred his pair with Clark of Arkansas to Carmack, and voted in the affirmative.

The bill as amended was then passed by a unanimous vote.
