## What Has Happened in the Territory Since Our Last Issue

### AN INTERESTING COLLECTION

Of Clippings From Newsy Contemporaries—Gossip of the Busy Week—Activity in the Southern Counties is Pronounced—Douglas City Notes.

City conventions were held in Phoenix at the same time by both democrats and republicans last Thursday night, the following tickets being nominated: Democrats—For mayor, Chas Goldman; councilman second ward, William H. Ward; councilman fourth ward, Joseph Bush. Republicans—For mayor, Henry C. Yaeger; councilman second ward, Shirley A. Christy; councilman fourth ward, Claud W. Cisney.

The Phoenix & Eastern is building a very substantial bridge across the Gila river at Ripsey wash three miles below Kelvin. The piers on either side are of heavy masonry resting on bedrock 80 feet beneath the river, and cost \$85,000. The main structure of the bridge will be a steel span 360 feet long. The construction of the bridge will require seven months.

At noon last Saturday in Safford Herman Lammers committed suicide by shooting himself three times with a 41-calibre revolver. Those who heard the gun's report say that there was at least a minute's interval between the shots. The three bullets entered the left breast one passing through the heart. Lammers had been employed as forman for the Federal Mining Mining company for a year or more and had but recently resigned that position and opened a tin shop in Safford.

### PINAL COUNTY BUDGET FROM FLORENCE BLADE

Alex Dryden, who was under sheriff of Pinal county, under Pete Gabriel, over twenty years ago, is now mining at Kingman, Mojave county. He is interested in the Alta company and is superintendent of their mines.

The last carload of machinery for the Coleman ice plant at Kelvin has arrived. It is strictly modern and should do the "freezing" act to perfection. The building in which the plant will be housed is nearing completion and Mr. Coleman expects to commence ice making next month.

The Superior company has another carload of their rich copper ore delivered on the platform of their warehouse at the Florence depot. The rainy weather has made ore hauling difficult and has also delayed the hauling of the new Rand compressor from the depot to the mine.

Engineers Westerfield and McDermott of the Ray company are making active preparations for the operation of the old Ray mine. Fifteen men are now being worked, and 100 will probably be employed when full operations are commenced.

The Arizona smelting company has been requested to put in a sampler at Kelvin and it is pretty certain they will do so, an official of the company having virtually given assurance that such action would be taken.

Manager Seiboth, of the Superior, was here Wednesday attending to the forwarding of freight. Now that the supreme court has affirmed the judgment of the lower court, quieting the title to the Superior mines, Mr. Seiboth proposes to rush development work on the company's properties, and also to speed the construction of the Florence & Superior railroad.

### THE GILA VALLEY

Gist of the News from the Guardian, Journal and Bulletin

It is reported that grain and alfalfa fields are not so far advanced as at this time last year, although the prospects for heavy yields are excellent.

Luther Green was confined to his bed for several days last week with a badly bruised knee, and is only able to be about now with the aid of a crutch.

Workmen are making good progress with the repairs on Judge C. E. Moorman's residence. Substantial stone foundations have been put down, and a number of new walls will be built. A new well has also been dug.

The report is current among the employees of the G. V., G. & N. that Supt. C. C. Mallard will resign about the 22d inst., to become assistant superintendent of the Union depot at El Paso. Mr. Mallard's successor is said to be a conductor on the Southern Pa-

cific from Tucson. [Mr. Mallard says he knows nothing of this.—Ed.]

Last week many taxpayers were staggered by the size of bills against the county created by the justice court of Morenci, says the Bulletin. Something like \$1,900 was the amount it cost the county to maintain the justice court in that precinct for the months of January, February and March. Although the claims were allowed in full there seems to be no doubt that the officers had availed themselves of the opportunity afforded by the present fee system to work their limit, with a view single to the fee of the officer rather than to the peace of the community.

The members of the old Safford council held a meeting last Thursday evening to attend to unfinished business, before retiring in favor of the incoming board. The new members were present and after being sworn into office by Justice Fonda, the new council held their first meeting, Geo. A. Olney was elected mayor.

O. W. Banta returned to Safford Thursday and showed some fine specimens of rich gold bearing ore, that beats anything yet found in the region of the Gila valley. The samples brought to the Journal office assayed \$78.90 gold, besides being very rich in copper and lead.




