The Republican Legislative Ticket

GEO. W. P. HUNT
At a meeting of the Gila County Republican Central Committee held Friday, October 19, 1906, the vacancy on the legislative ticket was filled by the nomination of Hon. George W. P. Hunt for the legislative council. This was a handsome and well-deserved compliment to Mr. Hunt, made in recognition of his long public service and eminent qualifications as a legislator. He has represented this county several terms in both houses of our territorial legislature, always with credit and honor to both the county and himself. Mr. Hunt will be elected to the next legislature without opposition—an honor which would be accorded to but few citizens of any community. While we are pleased to make this announcement, we would go a little farther and say that we are satisfied that Mr. Hunt should there be a democratic majority in the next council, will be chosen to preside over that body. He occupied this position during the session of the last legislature, and his actions and rulings were unformly fair and impartial. He is an ideal presiding officer.

James R. Nevin
We have had occasion heretofore to speak of Mr. Nevin as a candidate for the legislative house of representatives, but we may plead as an excuse for this notice that it is timely, as the legislative ticket by the action of the central committee was completed on Friday afternoon by the selection of Hon. G. W. P. Hunt to head the ticket, a more extended notice of the next on the ticket may be permitted. Mr. Nevin is one of Globe's most prominent citizens and business men, having come here over a year ago from Clifton. Upon coming here he opened in a modest way a feed and fuel business on upper Broad street. The business has expanded until he was forced to enlarge by taking in a partner and the firm is now known as Nevin, Coffee & Co. and does a large business, which is keeping pace with the demands of this rapidly growing community. It is reasonable to expect that any person who is an unqualified success in his private business cannot but be the same when the public interests are entrusted to his hands. Mr. Nevin, besides his natural abilities, possesses more than the average education—probably to a greater extent than a casual acquaintance with him would indicate. When the clerk of the assembly calls the roll of members at the next session, it will contain the name of no one more devoted to the public interests than that of J. R. Nevin.

Delegates to the Proposed Constitutional Convention
The political conventions of both parties in Gila county thought proper to name three candidates for the proposed constitutional convention who would be members of the convention to frame a constitution for the state of Arizona, in case the referendum would result in a majority of the voters of the territory favoring jointure with New Mexico. The nominees of the republican convention were G. S. Van Wagenen, Forrest J. Kaldenberg, and George B. Chittenden. It must not be supposed that a vote for these gentlemen means a vote in favor of jointure. On the contrary, each and every one of these eminent men are individually opposed to the jointure, and will plate a X to the left of "No" on his ballot. The three gentlemen named above are the most prominent in the county and are well known to all the voters. They are all men of high character and are well qualified to represent the people in any way.

G. S. Van Wagenen.—Mr. Van Wagenen is the Broad street newsdealer, next door to the postoffice. He is one of the principal business men of Globe. Mr. Van Wagenen enjoys a wide friendship and acquaintance in Gila county and Globe, where he has resided for many years.
Forrest J. Kaldenberg.—Mr. Kaldenberg is the superintendent of the Live Oak Mining company, and has been a resident of Globe for the past eighteen years. He has a host of friends and is well and favorably known.
George B. Chittenden.—Mr. Chittenden is a resident of the new camp of Christmas, in the southern part of the county. He is a mining man, being the superintendent of the Saddle Mountain Mining company, which is operating at Christmas. He is a wide awake progressive citizen.
However, these gentlemen will never have an opportunity to exercise their eminent fitness for constitution making, for the very votes that would elect them for the position will defeat the jointure under which they would act.

Messrs. Hunt and Nevin will prove to be leading representatives in the twenty-fourth legislative assembly. Gila county will be ably represented in both ho ses.
