THE FORTUNES OF OUR PRESIDENTS.

The American Historical Record gives the following statement of the private fortunes of all the Presidents, from Washington to Grant: Washington left an estate worth nearly \$300,000. The elder Adams left a moderate fortune at his death. Jefferson died comparatively poor. If Congress had not purchased his library at a price far above its value (\$20,000) he would with difficulty have kept out of bankruptcy at the close of his life. Madison saved his money and was comparatively rich. The fortune of his widow was increased by the purchase of his manuscript papers by Congress for \$30,000. James Monroe, the sixth President, died so poor that he was buried at the expense of his relatives, in a cemetery between Second and Third streets, near the Bowery, in New York city. Jefferson died comparatively poor. If Congress had not purchased his library at a price far above its value (\$20,000) he would with difficulty have kept out of bankruptcy at the close of his life. Madison saved his money and was comparatively rich. The fortune of his widow was increased by the purchase of his manuscript papers by Congress for \$30,000. James Monroe, the sixth President, died so poor that he was buried at the expense of his relatives, in a cemetery between Second and Third streets, near the Bowery, in New York city.

As Old Landmark Gone.—Pap Hunt, one of the old pioneers of the Pacific Coast, died at the County Hospital on Wednesday night, aged between 70 and 80 years. Pap came to the coast in 1849, and was well known to all the early settlers of California as a sporting man. In those days he conducted a monte game, and made a large amount of money, all of which was long since spent. Pap's life was a checkered and eventful one. He was engaged in almost every enterprise in which there was personal danger, particularly when there was a chance for a fight with the Mexicans. He was an interpreter for General Scott in Mexico, and spoke the Spanish language fluently. In 1842 he was one of the band of Texas Rangers who went into Mexico to make reprisals, and was captured at Mier. The Mexicans decided to spare the lives of three of their captives and placed a lot of beans in a box, all of them black but three. Pap was one of the lucky ones who drew white beans, and thus escaped being shot. Pap has suffered from dropsy and dysentery for some time, and his death has been anticipated for a long time. His memory will be kindly cherished by many a pioneer who knew him in his better days. —[Sac. Record, 11th.]
