SCENE IN A SOUTHERN COURT.

A correspondent writing from Teriene (Miss.) to the Memphis Appeal describes a thrilling scene before a colored Justice of the Peace, as follows:
I witnessed an amusing trial before a colored "squire" in this place to-day. The "squire" called the Court to order by saying: "All you negroes take off your hats in Court." Then, leaning back in his chair with all the dignity and pomp of Caesar, sang out to one of the parties: "Are you guilty or not guilty?" "Of what?" said the party. "Gilty presenting arms with intent to kill," said his Honor. "Not gilty," was the answer. "Whar is de proof?" The witnesses came forward and were examined by his Honor. Not a charge in the indictment was proved by the witnesses, but after he got through with the examination the "squire" folded his arms and said: "Now, jintlemen, I's here to spouse of the law, but I doesn't want to be hard with you. I think passion caused you to viose de law. I can't decide dis to be sat an' battery, for you didn't fight; I can't decide if manslaughter, for no one is killed; I can't decide if petty lawency, as de law direct, and finds you \$25 and costs." One of the party remarked: "If your Honor please, I am charged in the indictment with presenting deadly weapons, with intent to kill. Not a word in the charge has been proven. If your Honor insists on so large a fine, I shall appeal from your decision." The "squire" then remarked: "Now, Mr. —, if you is 'sposed to be fussy, I will bind you over to Court." But at this point the Marshal took his Honor out. After showing him the importance of reducing the fine to stop the appeal, in order that they could pocket the costs and fine, his Honor reduced the fine to \$10—costs, \$9 each. This the parties agreed to pay. Thus ended this interesting trial.

THAD. STEVENS.—The Washington Chronicle is responsible for the following new story of the old cominner:
A few days before Thad. Stevens died, some admirer intimated that in the event of his death there was no one then in the House to take his place as its leader. The cynical old man repeated the word "leader," saying: "Does anybody think that I have ever been a leader? Members that have wanted mean and dangerous work done, and were too decent or cowardly to do it themselves, have approached me, trying to make me believe that I was a leader. I have been fool enough to take the bait many times, and on a vote the cowards have always to a man abandoned the leader. Oh, I've been a great leader!"

SILVER AND GOLD.—The gold product of California is now about \$25,000,000 per annum. The silver product of Nevada has risen to nearly the same figure, and promises to surpass it the coming year. The bullion product of Utah, reckoning exported ores, is said to be \$10,000,000. Here we have say \$60,000,000 as the gold and silver product of these three divisions of the Union for one year. That used to be the yield of the California mines alone. The statistics of the mineral Territories show a general increase, and it cannot be long before the gross bullion yield of the Pacific and Rocky Mountain States and Territories will rise to \$100,000,000 per annum. —(S. F. Bulletin.)

The statement must also contain the value of the material in the market when it is delivered, the cost of transportation, and be sworn to before a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace, then forwarded to the Register of the Land Office, Belmont, Nevada, prior to February 1st, 1873.
