CARIBOU, COLORADO.

A correspondent, writing to the St. Louis Globe from Denver, Colorado, of date January 22, says:

There is great excitement at Caribou on account of recent valuable discoveries and recent developments in the mines there. Owing to its isolated situation, located, as it is, 10,000 feet above the sea, and up close to the summit of the "Snowy Range," the outside world know but little of what transpires there. Reliable parties say that these mines are the richest in the world, and yet the district which contains this hidden treasure is comparatively unknown outside the Territory. The mountain on which Caribou is located is one vast expanse of mines. In many places shafts have been sunk to a considerable depth, while others are but a few feet down, and every now and then new and valuable discoveries are being made. Among the most prominent mines is the "Caribou," the original discovery, owned and operated by two different parties. The east half of this mine produces, on an average, twenty-five tons of rich ore per day. It is rumored that a sale is pending of the west half, owned by Mr. Breed, and the price offered is said to be in the neighborhood of \$1,500,000. The Sherman lode yields ore producing from \$300 to \$600 per ton. The Seven-Thirty, a rich vein, has thirty-five tons of ore piled up inside the mine, of which \$1,000 per ton is realized from the first-class ore and \$350 for second class. The No Name has a vein seven inches in width, and valued at \$800 per ton. The Ontario, one of the most promising veins in the mountains, yields 700 ounces in silver to the ton. The Hinavassa, only recently discovered, exposes thirty inches of solid mineral at a depth of twenty feet. There are numbers of other mines equally valuable there, which are paying handsome dividends, but I have not space to mention them.

It is said that Governor Warmouth is confident of ultimate triumph. He is represented as having stated that he has consulted many leading Senators and Representatives and expressed his belief that the Senate committee on privileges and elections will report a measure giving Louisiana full relief.
