On Monday night, says the Nevada City (Cal.) Transcript of April 2, a boy named John Moore, aged 18 years, shot John Rogers at Sweetland, Bridgeport Township, blowing the top of his head off and killing him instantly. The circumstances, as we learn there, are these: Young Moore, who lives with his mother, caught Rogers in her bedroom some two weeks ago and ran him out of the house without his clothing. At that time young Moore warned Rogers that if he came to the house again he would kill him. Since then young Moore and his little brother have been on the watch, and on Monday night the younger one saw Rogers crawling through the window of the house, and notified his brother, who shot at him with a shotgun, the whole charge taking effect in his head and literally tearing the top of it off. We understand that the parties have heretofore borne a good reputation in the neighborhood, except that Mrs. Moore has for a year past been addicted to drinking. The affair caused considerable excitement in the vicinity, but the boy seems to have the sympathy of the community. We understand that the father and grown sister of the young man Moore are over the mountains, and that since they have been away the man Rogers has been going to the house and taking whisky with him to the woman.

DEATH OF A FORMER RESIDENT.—From the Pioche (Nev.) Daily Record we learn that Obadiah Brown, for more than seven years a citizen of this city and a brother of Thomas Brown, of Pepperell, died in that town, on the 31st of December, of pneumonia. He was by occupation a millwright, and his handicraft will live long beyond the days of the present generation. He leaves no family, but many friends in the wilds of the Pacific coast, who honor his memory for the many virtues he displayed in life. In his last illness he received every care and attention which fraternal sympathy and sincere friendship could suggest. In fact the Odd Fellows ministered to his every want, and his remains were borne to the tomb by the members of that benevolent Order. (Nashua (N. H.) Telegraph.
