FRIDAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

Most of the session yesterday was consumed in the introduction of documentary proof, through which the title of the party plaintiff was determined.

Colonel Raymond was cross-examined respecting a letter written by him to Col. Lighter.

Wm. Puffer testified that in 1864 he was living at Shoal Creek, about fifty miles from this place.

After some arguments on both sides, the witness proceeded. By the location, I was admitted to 150 feet; I consented to accept the location.
