The public debt destroyed shows a total debt of \$2,225,073,084; total interest, \$35,669,904; cash in the treasury, \$75,588,316; currency, \$6,055,799; special deposits held for redemption of certificates of deposit, as provided by law, \$23,125,000; total in the Treasury, \$110,779,115; debt less cash in the Treasury, \$2,114,293,973; decrease during the month, \$3,525,282.
