FACTS FROM THE CENSUS.

In connection with the census returns are statistics showing the extent of deafness and dumbness, blindness, insanity and idiocy. The detailed tables show that the blind, deaf and dumb and idiotic were mostly born and have remained east of the Rocky Mountains. California has 141 deaf and dumb, 179 blind, 1,146 insane, 87 idiotic. Nevada has 1,046 blind, 4 deaf and dumb, 2 insane, and 2 idiotic. Oregon has 35 blind, 23 deaf and dumb, 122 insane, and 55 idiotic. Montana has no blind person. Arizona has one idiot. New Mexico has 159 blind persons, which is a larger number than is reported for all the other Territories, including the District of Columbia, Arizona having only 1, Wyoming 5, Washington 5, Idaho 5, Colorado 26, and Utah 2. New Mexico has also 50 insane persons, Utah 25, Washington Territory 23, all other Territories 19. New Mexico had the largest number of deaf and dumb, 1,416, and all the other Territories together have only 13. The afflictions named are not only in the aggregate but are relatively very much less frequent west of the Rocky Mountains than east of that line. The reason assigned by scientists is that the increase of population on the Pacific coast is made up very largely by emigration, and blind, deaf and dumb, insane or idiotic persons are more apt to stay in the thickly settled portions of the country, leaving the healthy and able-bodied as the emigrants. Besides, it is generally accepted as a fact that the climate of California is remarkably healthy and exhilarating both to the nerves and senses. New Mexico is a Territory that has been more or less settled since the early days, and the same rule that would account for an excess of these afflictions in the Eastern and Middle States as compared with the Pacific coast, would apply in making the same comparison between the latter and New Mexico. California has four or five times as many insane persons as all the rest of the Pacific slope put together, but she is a comparatively old State, and the influx from all directions on the coast looks to her as a asylum.
