THE FERGUSON MURDER TRIAL.

Testimony for the Prosecution.

Yesterday, at 10 a. m., the taking of testimony was commenced in the third of the four murder cases to be tried during the present term of Court.

E. S. Williams, sworn—On the 13th of July last I was steward of the Hospital of this county; I knew Robert Ash, first as a patient in the Hospital, and afterwards as cook in the same institution;

Q—You say you did not know that they had had any trouble prior to that time. Did you not know the fact that on the 12th day of July the deceased Ash had threatened to whip three or four Irish s—of b—s, as he called them?

Q—Did not defendant about the time the quarrel commenced in his own room tell you for God's sake to pay Ash off and let him go or else he (Ash) would kill some one—that he was drunk and mad? A—He did not.

Q—Did you not on the 15th? A—I did not.

Q—Did you not on the 16th? A—I did not.

Q—Did you not on the 17th? A—I never did use those words, or words of like import, at the County Hospital, or at any other place.

Q—Have you not some animosity against this defendant? A—I have no animosity against him.

Q—Did you see defendant strike Ash with a knife—the point of a knife? A—I saw the defendant strike him with a knife, and I saw the wounds on the body of the deceased.

Mr. Williams, at the request of the prosecution, drew and explained to the jury a rough diagram of the hospital building, etc. This diagram was filed.

The jury asked that, as the trial might be a very long one, night sessions might be held. This was objected to by counsel on both sides. His honor then stated that the court would meet to-day at 9 a. m. instead of 10.
