Miscellaneous. Notice! Notice! OFFICE FLORAL SPRING WATER CO. July 30, 1873.

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE been duly adopted by resolution of the Board of Trustees of the FLORAL SPRING WATER CO. They are to be strictly observed by consumers of Floral Spring water:

1. In all cases of non-payment of the water rent within three days after presentation of bill the supply will be cut off until it is paid, and will not again be let on, either for the present or any subsequent account, except upon the payment of the amount due, together with the sum of two dollars; provided that in cases of specific supplies, or for fractional parts of the month, where the water has been cut off, it may be cut off immediately after notice given at the place that the rent is not paid, and may be let on again upon the conditions herein mentioned.

2. No person or family supplied with Floral Spring water will be permitted to use the same for any other purpose than that stated in this agreement, nor to supply water in any way to other persons or families.

3. Consumers shall prevent all unnecessary waste of water, and shall make no concealment of the purposes for which it is used.

4. Notifications shall be made in any watertight or fixture without first giving notice of the intended alteration at the office of the water company.

5. In all cases where water is to be supplied to several parties or tenants from one connection, or tap, the Company contracts only with the use of said several parties, and on his default to abide these regulations, and pay the rates, will cut off the connection.

6. Whenever any of these regulations shall be violated the supply of water will be discontinued, and will not be resumed until all charges and expenses are satisfied.

7. All persons taking water shall keep their service pipes in good repair, and their own expense, and they will be held liable for all damages which may result from their failure to do so.

8. Sprinkling with hose and standing irrigators will not be allowed under any circumstances.

9. The inspector, or other properly authorized officer of the Company, shall be satisfied at all reasonable hours to all parts of any premises supplied with water, to see that these regulations are observed.

The attention of customers having pipe connections is hereby called to above Rules and Regulations, adopted by the Board of Trustees, and which are hereafter embodied in all contracts for water, and which shall be signed before the supply will be furnished. The above regulations will be strictly enforced, and parties neglecting or refusing to comply with them will have their supply of water discontinued at once. The Company reserves the right of placing meters on all pipes supplied through the pipes, in which case two and one-half cents per gallon will be charged for the water used, and one-half the cost of the meter and placing upon the premises. Parties having hose, in case of fire, will be allowed to use water to extinguish the same for the purpose of saving their property.
