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COLLEGE FOLLY.

(From the *Times* (N. Y.) Advertiser.)
A brief dispatch to the Associated Press on Saturday reads thus:
"Mortimer, son of M. D. Leggett, U. S. Commissioner of Patents, was killed last night by falling from a cliff near Ithaca, N. Y."
