Quillen and Dean have thoroughly repaired and renovated the saloon and bowling alley on Meadow Valley street, known as "Grove's," and will reopen this evening, when they will be glad to see their friends and the public. There will be no charge for the use of the alley beyond the cost of liquid refreshments.

REWARD.—We see by the Europa papers that Wells, Fargo & Co. have offered a reward of \$600 for the arrest and conviction of the men who robbed the stage the other day.

THANKS.—Yesterday was quite a warm day, and J. L. Scott, driver of the Crystal Ice Depot wagon, was thoughtful enough to bring around a liberal supply of ice, which was duly appreciated.

COLLECTING.—The Committee of Arrangements report that they have been so far quite successful in disposing of tickets for the ball on Friday night, and a very large assemblage may be expected. The stage arrived yesterday without having to report a visit from highwaymen. This was refreshing as the daily robberies were becoming monotonous.

BULLION SHIPMENT.—Wells, Fargo & Co. yesterday shipped bullion amounting to \$3,521.

JELSEY DISTRICT, which has caused such an excitement among miners, is situated about 40 miles a little south of east from Unionville. The discovery was the result of an accident. Shepherders had camped in its immediate vicinity for two or three years, and had frequently sat down on its prominent crappings, never suspecting that they contained anything valuable, or that a blow of a sledge or pick would reveal the hidden treasures beneath them. We understand that Gen. Connor, of the Oregon Smelting Works, has made arrangements with the owners of one or both of the mines to smelt a lot of the ore, and as Oregonia is the nearest railroad point from the mines, it is probable that all the ore produced will be reduced there.

YESTERDAY a large rock got into the pipe at the hydraulic diggings on Cedar Hill and made things lively for a time. As the water could not pass out at the end of the pipe, and the pressure being tremendous, something had to give way, the main pipe pulled apart at a joint, and then began to leak about as an as tonishing rate, throwing one section some rods. When the water was shut off above it went over the hill and astonished some of the natives in that direction. It required some hours to repair the damages and get all in perfect working order again. The boys at the mine will hereafter keep a sharp lookout for rocks.

FROM A. M. Hillhouse we learn that the people of White Pine are very hopeful that the old camp will make another prosperous start before long. The mines of Treasure Hill are all looking well, which, taken in connection with the very excellent prospect for the inauguration of the extensive smelting operations, justifies the people of that section in anticipating a speedy change for the better. Capital is being directed in the mines of White Pine in all that is necessary to bring about a very satisfactory condition of things over that way.

THE State Board of Regents, composed of Messrs. Jerry Schoelling, Sylvester H. Day and P. H. Clayton, met yesterday, and accepted the State University building, upon the favorable report of Mr. Schoelling, who examined the same while on a visit to Elko for that purpose, at the time of the University ball given there. The board will meet again at an early day, and appoint their principal teacher, who will be instructed to take hold and start the University forthwith.

AT 7:30 last evening a blast was exploded on the lot which is being graded on B street by Mr. Marye, the broker, who so shook the neighborhood that many persons supposed it an earthquake shock. The report was scarcely heard, but the shaking was very lively.
