Meadow Valley Mine.

We are pleased to learn that the machinery for this mine is in a very forward state and that there is no doubt that it will be finished and shipped in time to get it in this season.

The iron works are running their full force upon it, and sparing neither time nor money to get it finished.

The pumping engine is the largest of the kind ever built, which has necessitated a complete set of new patterns and plans, involving a much longer time than originally contemplated.

A somewhat similar style of engine was made by the Mason Iron Works Company for the Alta mine in Nevada, and which has proved the most successful one on the Comstock lead, and has opened a new era in pumping water.

Some idea of the economy in fuel of the Alta engine, may be gathered from the fact, that a single 48 in. x 16 in. boiler runs easily this engine—37 inch initial cylinder and 40 inch compound cylinder—working a 14 inch pump from a depth of 600 feet and a hoisting engine, 12x24, sinking at the rate of about 100 feet per month.

Engineer Ames, who is superintending the new machinery, promises to beat even this figure. The water will be a god-send to our mills, and in that way more than pay for its pumping. We but reflect the sentiment of the camp when we say that the prospect justifies the outlay and will in the future amply recompense all for the chances they take.

Let the ore ledge now in the Meadow Valley be sunk on and developed and every claim on the line will spring into life.
