## PROPOSED AMENDMENT AND RE- VISION OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE

of Nevada, passed at the seventh session of the  
Legislature:  
Resolved, by the Assembly, the Senate con-  
curring, That the Constitution of the State of  
Nevada be amended as follows:  
Amend Section one of Article IX of the Con-  
stitution of the State of Nevada so as to read as  
follows:  
Section 1. The fiscal year shall commence  
on the first day of December in each year.  
Passed January 19, 1875.  
Resolved, by the Assembly, the Senate con-  
curring, That our history as a State, has taught  
us the necessity of revising the Constitution;  
we therefore recommend the electors, at the  
next election for members of the Legislature, to  
vote for or against the calling of a Convention  
for the purpose of revising the Constitution of  
the State of Nevada.  
Passed February 18, 1875.
