### WAR ITEMS.

London, July 31.—Mehemet Ali's van guard is within 20 miles of Tirnova.

### A BATTLE RAGING.

London, July 31.—Sultman Pasha and his corps effected a junction with Raou Pasha near Terni, Scigraha, and an engagement is proceeding.

### ENGLISH WAR VESSELS.

Her majesty's steamers Flamingo and Condon, which go to the Danube to protect British interests and assert Great Britain's right to maintain two gun-boats on the Black Sea by the iron-clads Shannon and Agincourt, to support them should their passage be opposed.

## THE DOMINION.

### ACCIDENT.

Toronto, July 31.—A street drain caved yesterday killing Chas. D. Brown, and F. W. Laughlin, and three other men were badly injured.

### A SMALL FIRE.

Montreal, July 31.—Esplin's box factory saw and planing mills burned this morning. Loss \$25,000; insurance \$10,000.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

### NO CHANGE.

No change this morning. Everything is quiet. Business fully resumed. It is reported that a number of companies at east St. Louis have been sent to Springfield Ills. to guard the coal mines in that vicinity against strikers, but confirmation of report has not been obtained.

### WITHOUT INTERRUPTION.

New York, July 31.—The Delaware Lackawanna and Western railroad trains are running without interruption and the Morris and Essex is in proper order.

### VIOLENCE BY RIOTERS.

Baltimore, July 31.—A locomotive, tender and one car of the troops' train were thrown from the track two miles west of Keyser, West Virginia, by a misplaced switch. Ten soldiers were injured. The crew of the Grafton train arrived at Keyser and are to receive fifty dollars each. These reopen the third division.

Samuel Bergamin has been arrested on charge of rioting in the 6th regular army on the night of July 20th.

### SUCCESSFUL ROUSTABOUTS.

Cairo, July 31.—The negro roustabouts struck for and got an advance of twenty to thirty cents per hour.

### FRESH TROUBLE EXPECTED.

Cincinnati, July 31.—Under orders from Gov. Young, five companies of the Ohio national guard, under command of Col. C. D. Hunt, left here on the early train this morning for Columbus, where is expected fresh trouble with the strikers.

### APPREHENSIONS.

Chicago, July 31.—Some apprehension existed yesterday and last night lest the engineers on the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad, who have been indicating their intention to strike, would join the firemen and stop all trains. This did not, however, occur, as up to midnight nearly all the engineers on the road not already at work had signified their intention of resuming this morning. The road is now ready to do its usual business on all branches and other roads are also running trains about as usual and a large amount of freight is moving.

### GOING OVER TO FRANCE.

Philadelphia, July 31.—Gov. Noyes, U. S. minister to France sails to-day for his post, in the steamship Illinois.

### MILITARY AND INDIAN MOVEMENTS.

San Francisco, July 31.—A Portland Press dispatch says that Gen. Howard is at present at Kamia awaiting the arrival of Major Sanford. As soon as that officer joins him Howard will take all available force and push vigorously after Joseph and Whitebird, who have already crossed the Bitter Root mountains by way of the Lolo trail. He will go through to Missoula as rapidly as his command can move. He will have in the neighborhood of five hundred men. Another force under command of Gen.

Wheaton will leave for Lapwai, and moving north will pass through the Spokane country and cross over into Montana through Sahon pass. After crossing the mountains the troops will push down to Missoula, where they will join Gen. Howard. It is expected that Howard's and Wheaton's detachments will reach that point simultaneously. Wheaton will command about 450 or 500 troops.

## SARATOGA RACES.

Saratoga, July 31.—The two mile dash was won by Tom O'Chiltree; Athene second. Time 3.39½. Saratoga stakes for two year olds, Barneite won; Duke Magenta second. Time 1.17½.

The selling race, one mile and was won by Lucifer; Cardinal Wolsey second; George the fourth third. Time 1.58½.

## LEGAL TENDERS.

Washington, July 31.—Legal tenders decreased this month \$670,000 eighty per cent of the rate bank notes issued during the month.
