THE NEW NORTHWEST.

There are five circus companies wintering in Kansas.

The Catholic fair in Waseca, Minnesota, raked in \$1,000.

Helena, Montana, had a \$1,650 fire on New Year's day.

The Iowa legislature convened at Des Moines, Jan. 12th.

The Denver policemen get \$90 per month and a gray uniform.

Twenty-two persons died of typhoid fever in Denver last month.

There is talk at St. Paul of founding a college to be in control of the Presbyterians.

Mrs. Burnett's new story will be of American life, and will be called "Louisiana."

Senator J. P. Jones is reported to have made \$250,000 through the sale of a Colorado mine.

Des Moines and Council Bluffs, 144 miles apart, are placed in communication by telephone.

Fayette county, Iowa, has a Farmers' Mutual Insurance company with a capital of \$300,000.

Salina, Kansas, has organized a coal stock company, with a capital of \$10,000, at \$10 per share.

Population in Colorado increases in a ratio of ten to one, as compared with any other western state.

There are over 400 new dwelling houses in Portland, Oregon, in the course of erection at the present time.

Rev. H. K. Painter was installed on the 8th as pastor of the Congregational church, at Mazepa, Minnesota.

A Warren county Iowa farmer, raised last year 376 bushels of corn on three and five eighths acres of ground.

J. M. Hartley's store in Brainerd, Minnesota, was partially destroyed by fire on Christmas morning. Loss \$100.

Sixty boot blacks and news boys took dinner at Temperance Headquarters in Topeka, Kansas, on New Year's day.

It is reported that an 18-year old boy and a 40-year-old married woman of Dubuque fell in love with each other and eloped.

The annual meeting of the Dakota county, Minnesota, agricultural society will be held in Farmington on Saturday, the 31st inst.

Forty-two members have been recently initiated into the Good Templars Lodge at Ellis, Montana, which is in a flourishing condition.

Scarlet fever has broken out in the deaf and dumb asylum at Oathee, Kansas, and to-day there is a regular stampede among the inmates.

Thus far reports from towns in Winona county, Minnesota, show a decrease in the number of births and an increase in the number of deaths.

Davenport, Iowa, physicians report a larger number of births in the past seven days than they have ever known before in the same period of time.

The merchants of Rushford, Minnesota, say they have not had in three years three months' business equal in magnitude to that of the last three months.

The body of John McDuffey, of Chippewa county, Minnesota, who was lost New Year's day, has been found frozen about twelve miles from Wilmar.

The hog cholera is raging in some portions of Des Moines county, Iowa. The disease does not seem to affect the fat hogs, but is killing off the young ones.

The January thaw cleared the river entirely of ice, so that at Davenport the small steamboat made trips to the neighboring towns. This is something unusual for January.

One Anson E. Losey, who married a wife in Crookston, Minnesota, a few months ago, has now fled to Dakota, upon the discovery that he had deserted a wife in Michigan.

The Gallatin river in Montana has frozen over with its confluence with the Missouri, so that it will admit of trains crossing. This has not occurred but two or three times in eighteen years.

Farmers in Minnesota, who have borrowed seed grain from the state are officially notified that its value will be assessed against them, and the state must have the full amount nominated in the bond.

Sedan Kansas Times: A man whose name we will not publish was fined twenty-five dollars last week by Squire Ross, for striking his five months old child so hard in the face as to cause extensive black and blue marks.

Michigan capitalists have agreed to build at Duluth, Minnesota, this year, ready for the wheat crop of 1880, a large grist-mill, and another Michigan firm has engaged to invest \$50,000 in building this year a large saw mill.

There has been a disastrous prairie fire in Saline and McPherson counties, Kansas, in which J. Wadman, an old man, was burned to death. Mr. Chilton lost a span of horses, and Mr. Lewis, in the same vicinity, lost horses, wagon and harness.

The rumors of a scandalous nature which were afloat in Morris, Minnesota, last Saturday, culminated Monday in the arrest of a prominent business man, Mr. J. M. Moore, on a charge of "an assault with intent to commit rape upon the person of Mrs. Ellen Zimmerman." After a hearing before a justice the defendant was discharged, and there are intimations that blackmail was the object in view.
