THE NEW NORTHWEST.

This has been the roughest winter seen in Utah for twenty-seven years.

Burlington, Iowa, expects to put 10,000,000 brick in buildings this season.

Hay is becoming scarce in Salt Lake and now commands twenty-two dollars a ton.

The present has been the severest winter experienced in Oregon since its occupation by Americans.

The Dubuque Times is one of the ablest, and, as recent events have proved, one of the most influential journals in Iowa.

Audubon, Iowa, children are battling with the measles. One citizen, a Mr. Finch, lost five children within a week's time.

About 100,000 head of cattle will be driven east from the ranges of eastern Oregon and Washington Territory this spring.

"The Grant boys in Iowa came home from Des Moines on foot," says the Hawkeye. "They will return from Chicago in Pullman cars."

One creamery in Fayette county, Iowa, paid out \$11,000 during the month of March for milk, at \$1.00 per hundred pounds.

During the past seven months five hotels have burned between Mendocino City and Bridgeport, Mendocino county, California, a distance of twenty miles.

An Omaha bartender was thoughtless enough to ask for a drink and was knocked down with a chair. The Omaha dead-beat will stand no nonsense.

M. D. Smith, a merchant of Pine City, Minn., while crossing the ice on Snake river about a mile from that city, broke through. He was drowned, together with his horse.

Iowa City has probably given the world more orators, statesmen, actors and men and women of prominence in the various occupations of life, than any other city of that state.

The mines on Skagit river in Washington Ter., are attracting very many although the season has not yet really opened. Great excitement prevails over a rich strike on Sauk river.

The growing of swamp willows for basket purposes has been experimented on by an Olympia, Washington Ter., man and found to pay well. The manufacture of baskets has been inaugurated and promises well.

The survey for the narrow gauge from Smithfield to Dallas in Utah has been completed, and the work of grading will commence at once. Within sixty days the engine will run through the streets of Dallas.

Mrs. T. P. Root, whose husband committed suicide in Dubuque, Iowa, in January, has received from various societies with which he was connected, and insurance companies, \$9,000 in payment of policies held by him.

Albert Lee, (Minnesota), Enterprise: About fifty German arrived at this place last Friday afternoon over the Southern Minnesota railway, thirty-three of whom were direct from the old country and the balance from Wisconsin.

The postmaster general has ordered the establishment of a postoffice at Ulidia, Montana. It is to be situated at Gibson's ferry, on the Missouri river, between Sun river and Chestnut, and will accommodate a large number of people.

Messrs. Samuel T. Hauser, Andrew J. Davis and others have secured from the government a charter for a First National bank at Fort Benton with a capital stock of \$100,000. The new association will commence business at an early day.

Breckenridge, an old mining camp, situated just east of Fairplay, Colorado, and well known to old Coloradans, which has been deserted for several years, is once more receiving considerable attention, and already has a population of over 4,000 people.

At Leadville, Colorado, April 11th, Lawrence Fitzgerald, a miner, was fatally shot by Geo. Tattersall while quarreling over a claim owned by Fitzgerald, which Tattersall attempted to jump. A second murder occurred in the Coliseum theatre, J. W. Overton, the proprietor, being fatally shot by Thomas Unyent, a bar tender, while engaged in a quarrel.

The news from Leadville, Col., is that there is a great rush from there to the Gunnison country during this month, in fact, if half the people go from there, that are talking of going, there will scarcely be men enough left to work the mines in and around Leadville, for almost every one you meet, no matter whether he is a miner or merchant, says he is off for the Gunnison country.

A Montana man, accompanied by his dog, went out rabbit-hunting. He found a rabbit, shot at it and missed. The dog gave chase, but after a short run, stopped and the rabbit escaped. The man was so enraged that he attempted to brain the pup with the butt-end of his gun. The dog dodged the blow, but the man struck the ground and knocked off a piece of ore that assayed \$50,000 to the ton and is now a millionaire. We never lie. Next—

A lady named Tucker, assisted by a servant girl was cleaning house at Pin Oak, Iowa, on Friday, when they came upon an old gun stowed away in a closet. Mrs. Tucker attempted to pull the gun out from behind a shoe box, having clutched the weapon by the muzzle. Suddenly there was a deafening report and the lady staggered back and fell to the floor dead. Six buck-shot had entered her body making a fearful looking wound. Her heart was literally shot to pieces.
