GODDEN'S BALLOON TO REACH CANADA ON FIRST TRIP

After its Christening Tomorrow the New England Aero Club's Airship Will Attempt the Prize Voyage to Montreal.

(Special from United Press.)

Pittsfield, Mass., May 14.—Piloted by Charles J. Godden, the new 56,000 cubic foot balloon Massachusetts of the Aero Club of New England, which is to be christened here to-morrow morning, will make an attempt to reach the Canadian frontier on its initial voyage.

The managers will be Charles J. Godden of Boston, Vice-President of the Aero Club of New England, and Geo. Otis Draper of Hopedale, nephew of Charles E. Draper.

Two prizes have been offered for the first pilot landing on the island of Montreal, one by the Automobile Club of Canada and another by the newspaper La Patrie.

SINGING SPARKS IMPROVED WIRELESS SYSTEM PERFECTED

Berlin, May 14.—"Singing sparks" is the expressive name given to an improved wireless system just perfected by the German Telefunken Wireless Telegraphy Company. Messrs. Sack and Arco, the chief engineers of the company, after whom the German system is generally called, have invented a device, which is simple and entirely obviates the uncertainties with which other wireless systems hitherto have had to contend.

The new device consists in sending out the vibrations which form the messages as pure musical tones, which are capable of being heard by the receiver, no matter how softly they may be uttered.

It is declared by the inventors that by means of this device it will be possible for the first time since the wireless telegraphy was established to maintain communication by this means in spite of the most violent atmospheric disturbances. Another advantage claimed is that it will be possible to work with much smaller antennae for the aerial wires by which the energy is absorbed.

In their message through the air the singing sparks will be entirely noiseless.
