THE EVOLUTION OF A SUNDAY SCHOOL

How Poor White Boys of the Georgia Mountains Are Being Given an Opportunity for Useful Livelihood Through the Berry Industrial School.

(Miss Berry is the founder and director of one of the most unique educational institutions in the South which she describes in this article—an institution which is meeting one of the little thought of southern problems—the poor boys of the mountains.)

Ten years ago in a little log-cabin at my home I began teaching a few poor boys and girls in a little Sunday school. Seeing their lack of education and visiting their homes in the different parts of the country, I discovered that the great and real need of these people was an industrial school on their own ground, where they could be taught some farming and carpenter's work, the value of time and the dignity of labor.

I decided to start the school with a few boys and get them interested in making tables and benches out of boxes, and determined that we would do only such things as we were obliged to have. I bought a few cots and chairs and a stove, and we had a small kitchen stove. With this meagre outfit the Berry School began its existence January 13, 1902. A friend volunteered to give her services as a teacher. Our industrial department consisted of four hoes, one spade, two rakes and one plow. We had only one horse, "Rony," which we called our Sunday school horse.

Three out of the first eighteen boys we had graduated from our school and are holding positions of trust. One of them is leading his classes at the University of Georgia, and is president of the Y. M. C. A. Another is teaching and helping to uplift poor and ignorant country boys.

HONEST BUTTER AND EGGS

The Connecticut House of Representatives has declared for honest eggs and honest butter.

The "Egg bill" passed the House Friday afternoon without amendment although Mr. Bishop of New Haven tried hard to take the teeth out of it by inserting the word "knowingly." The Bishop amendment was lost by a vote of 82 to 32.

Section 1. Every person, firm or corporation who shall offer for sale eggs which have been kept in cold storage where chemicals are used, in pipes or otherwise, to create a low temperature, or have been preserved by any artificial processes, shall affix to the package or receptacle containing such eggs, or shall conspicuously display with such eggs, a label or placard bearing in plain letters not less than one inch in height the words "cold storage eggs" or "preserved eggs," as the case may be.

Section 2. Failure to comply with the provisions of this act, or the placing of such label or placard with eggs in such a manner as to misrepresent the quality or condition of such eggs shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$25.

Section 3. The provisions of Section 1 of the General Statutes, as amended, which are necessary for the enforcement of this act are made part hereof.

Section 1. No person shall, by himself, his servant or agent, sell, or offer for sale, or have in his possession with intent to sell any butter unless the package or wrapper containing the same shall have conspicuously printed thereon, in letters or figures not less than one-half inch in height, in plain Gothic type, the net weight of the butter contained therein.

Section 2. The provision of Section 2566 of the General Statutes, and any amendments thereof, which are necessary for the enforcement of this act are made a part hereof.

Section 3. Every person who shall violate any provision of this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$25.
