

BOOKS OF SAMUEL H. HARRIS LODGE, I. O. O. F., EXAMINED BY EXPERT, SHOW SHORTAGE

Membership Dues Paid to John J. Curley, Financial Secretary, Have Not Been Deposited With Treasurer

The books of John J. Curley, financial secretary of Samuel H. Harris Lodge I. O. O. F., have been examined by an expert accountant, and show a shortage amounting to several thousand dollars. The work of untangling the snarl has not been completed, and it is expected that the deficiency will be found to be greater than the amount already disclosed. Secretary Curley has turned over to the lodge his equity in a dwelling owned by him. The equity is valued at \$3,000. It will not begin to make up the shortage.
