FAIRFIELD

Another half day was spent yesterday in an endeavor to get at the truth regarding the assault perpetrated upon Washington Turney the night when the town was filled with rumors of bloody murder. An interpreter for Mr. Negy, the accused, having been found, he was put upon the stand and testified that he received word his wife was in danger of her life, and rushing home, he found Turney on the stoop of the kitchen with a gun in his hand, the barrel of which he pushed into Negy's eye. A wrestling match followed, during which the old man fell to the floor, and in doing so his forehead came in contact with the lock of the gun from the gentleman who had been accused of shooting one of the good woman's chickens. Mr. Negy denied either he or his wife struck the man, or kicked him. He asserted he did not even go into the Turney part of the house but stood outside all the time on the stoop. Dr. James E. Hair of Bridgeport testified that he examined Mr. Turney on the 17th of Aug. a day or two after the assault. He found a contusion on the scalp about one inch long; two broken ribs, and a contusion, or black and blue spot, about one of the knees. He did not say that more than two ribs were broken. There was no contusion over the place of the fractured ribs, which would indicate a blow or a kick. The bruise on the knee might have been caused by falling to the floor. There was no external evidence of a blow. The stories told by some of the other witnesses did not harmonize and it was evident mistakes were being made. Attorney King, in summing up, said it was a fact that Mr. Turney had been assaulted and was found in a very serious condition. Mrs. Allen actually saw the assault. In duty bound he would ask that Negy be bound over. When Attorney Cummings presented his arguments, he soon was eloquent and drew a large crowd into the court room. Nearly all the town officials were present, including the selectmen, the town clerk, and there was a large delegation of students from the Hargrove school, some of whom propose to study law. Near by residents watching scenes of the trial, dropped in, until the court room presented an interesting appearance. Mr. Cummings urged the plea of self defense, and the state, on the other hand, Negy was strangers in a strange country trying to earn an honest living. He doubted the testimony of the witnesses, and made a strong appeal for mercy. Mr. Justice Wakemarr did not deem it necessary to review the evidence, but on probable cause, bound Negy over to the September term of the Superior Court, under \$300 bonds, and Mr. Charles Keys, brother-in-law of Negy, qualified as bondsman. Frank McKenna with his attorney, John P. Gray, was up before the Justice, charged with exposing liquors for sale on the beach on Sunday without a license. J. J. Gill was before the court on the same indictment. It was contended that beer is simply a potent factor in a clam bake, and was used to wash down the clams. McKenna is said to have been the purchasing agent for the beer, which was sent to the beach. As there appeared to be a legal question involved about which some doubt existed, the Justice requested the lawyers to submit briefs, and the case was continued for one week. Supt. William A.
