From 70 in 1895, the number of automobiles in this country has increased to 28,000 this year, and it is predicted that the number next year will be 200,000, valued at \$240,000,000.

According to the "National Review" of London, Germany is making "concessions and malignant efforts to generate friction between Japan and the United States."

The license or no-license question will be voted upon at the coming October elections in the towns, but under the new requirement that not less than 10 per cent. of the voters must petition for such tests of town sentiment.

At present, there are 37 no-license and 71 license towns, and these numbers are not likely to be materially changed, though it is a fact that some half-dozen towns cast very close votes at the last elections.

HOUSEHOLD NOTES

Some housekeepers make the mistake of drawing all cooking water from the hot water faucet. It should instead be drawn from the cold faucet, as the sediment that collects in the hot water is not wholesome.

Round wire screens to fit over the tops of vases or bowls may be had in various sizes. They are especially effective in catching blossoms in an upright position and are especially serviceable for short-stemmed flowers.

Hardwood dents may be removed by covering with several thicknesses of paper and pressing with a very hot iron; but after this process the blistered varnish will have to be sanded off and a new finish put on.

On times, the asbestos which has become discolored in the stove may be cleaned with common table salt. Sprinkle a little on the mat, light the gas stove burner and let the salt sizzle on top.

Red meats are less liable to contamination than fish or chicken. The latter should never be eaten if there is the least suspicion of odor about them. Beef slightly tainted, though disagreeable, will not produce ptomaine poisoning.

A clean pencil eraser or a piece of art gum is excellent for removing fresh spots from kid gloves. An application of either of these if put on the day when the glove must be sent to the cleaners.

USHERED IN TODAY

Going Down the Sun Marks 5670 of the Hebrew Calendar.

With the going down of the sun today the year 5670 of the Jewish calendar begins and with it begins the series of holy days which will be observed by the Hebrews with solemn religious rites.

The Day of Atonement comes 10 days after the new year begins and following the fast observed on this day is the Feast of Tabernacles, which covers a period of seven days.

The Day of Atonement is a fast day to atone for sins and is the Feast of Tabernacles is a reminder that the Israelites were brought out of the land of Egypt and dwelt in booths before reaching the promised land of Canaan.
