TEACHERS GET MORE SALARY

New Haven's Board of Education Unanimously Adopts Schedule Submitted by League.

MARTIN FULFILLS ELECTION PLEDGE

New Haven, Sept. 25.—By unanimous vote of the newly constituted Board of Education, John Day Jackson absent to the board, and rejected, by the Teachers' League, in June, 1907, and which the league has persistently fought for ever since, was adopted last night to become operative in full as requested by the teachers commencing with the fall of 1910.

Because the teachers and the city have already entered into a formal contract for the school year which opened this month, the schedule could not be put in operation until next fall, but action was taken at once in order to allow the Board of Education to send a committee before the board of finance next week to request a sufficient appropriation for next year to allow this increase in salaries.

With the three new appointees named by Mayor Martin last week taking office last night and two more in office from last year, the Mayor for the first time was given a chance to show his influence in the board in the carrying out of his election pledge to do whatever lay in his power in behalf of the adoption of the teachers' schedule and its adoption last night is regarded as a distinct fulfillment of his pledge with satisfactory results.
