COMMITTEE OF MRS. STETSON'S CHURCH INVESTIGATED

Denial Made of Friction With Trustees of "Mother" Church of Scientists

(Special from United Press.) New York, Oct. 19.—Greatly disturbed over the report that the board of trustees of First Church, Christian Science, is contemplating defying the action of the trustees of the mother church in Boston...

HOUSEHOLD NOTES

A new veil may be kept from stretching by threading the sewing machine with silk of the same color as the veil and stitching carefully along each edge.

To keep sweet potatoes, parsnips and oyster plant from turning dark as soon as they are boiled, add a little vinegar into the water in which they are soaked before cooking.

Circles of pasteboard of various sizes are convenient to put over glasses, cups, bowls or pitchers in which food or liquids are placed to cool or stand until needed.

To make children's rubbers wear longer, cut pieces the shape of the heel from the tops of old rubbers, apply some mullage to the cloth side, and press to the heel firmly.

Pecan meats may be removed whole if you boil the nuts for fifteen or twenty minutes, then pour off the water, but keep the pan covered. Shell the nuts while they are hot.

To make home-made paste, take a cooled potato, cut into small and smooth and rub over the surfaces of the articles to be attached, press smooth with a warm iron or the hand.

A suspected sample of ground coffee may be tested in this way: Place a teaspoonful of the coffee in a wine-glass containing water. If part sinks and the rest floats, it is adulterated.

To give a house fern a good shape, turn each new sprout towards the light until it is well up and begins to bend in the right direction.

If there is occasion to press bengaline or any heavily corded material, put it right side down on a piece of flannel or Turkish toweling. Then the cords will not press flat.
