WALL STREET TO-DAY.

New York, Oct. 22.—Stock market trading at the opening was heavy, only the leading specialties showing demand. Leading issues generally showed net losses during the first 15 minutes. Steel Common and Reading changed more than one point and other important industrial and railroad issues fell off.

11 a. m.—The sale of 10,000 shares in London caused a sharp decline in prices. Southern Pacific, Union Pacific and Steel Common were the heaviest offerings. The first hour ended

with material declines in all active issues. Government bonds unchanged; other bonds irregular.

TILYOU TAKES MORTGAGE ON STEEPLECHASE

Deed is Made by Steeplechase Co. of Which He is President.

MAY MEAN FUTURE PURCHASE

A mortgage deed for \$125,438.95 was given by the Steeplechase Island Co. today to George C. Tilyou to take up a note for the same amount which the company owed Mr. Tilyou. Mr. Tilyou in turn has turned the mortgage over to the Mechanic's Bank of Brooklyn. The mortgage covers the option which the Steeplechase Island Co. has upon the island property and such buildings on the property as are owned by the company. The sale of the mortgage is believed to be an indication that Mr. Tilyou, who is at the head of the Steeplechase Island Co., intends to purchase the property at the expiration of the 10 year option.

LITTLE HOPE FOR PREMIER MORET

Spain Can Trace Loss of Cuba and Philippines to His Mismanagement

WAS COLONIAL SECRETARY

(Special from United Press.)
Madrid, (via Hendaye), Oct. 22.—Senor Moret and his Liberal Cabinet today began the consideration and modification of the governmental repression in Barcelona and Geronca, which under Maura had become almost unendurable. Just how far Moret will go with his reform cannot be definitely stated, but it is generally understood that the government's repressive policy will be lightened only so much as is absolutely necessary to modify the country.

There is no doubt today that Moret's appointment is the result of political thimblefingering and that the life of the Liberal Cabinet will be short. Moret, while really a Liberal, is in reality the most reactionary leader of that party. No radical reform is to be expected from him and the general opinion is that he will endeavor to conciliate the factions whose plans threaten the life of Spain. That he will succeed no one believes.

Moret, as an administrator, has proved himself utterly incompetent. To his mismanagement, while colonial secretary, Spain can trace her loss of Cuba and the Philippines and the disastrous events of the American war.

Under the demands of the King, who is much aroused by the repressive measures which he insists Maura reported to without the royal sanction, Moret will be expected to make some move toward modifying conditions in the Spanish interior. Every action along this line will be met with lively opposition by the deposed Conservatives. At the same time Moret is working against his own inclination as he believes firmly in the Maura policy of repression. As a consequence politicians are certain that the new Moret Cabinet will make no genuine reforms. If it does not it will antagonize the Republican and Democratic elements of the Republican-Democratic Liberal Fusion which now supports it and the Cabinet would fall. This would be certain to result in Maura's reinstatement and a resumption of the Revolutionary agitation which may quiet for a time under a Liberal government.
