New York, Nov. 5.—Supreme Court Justice Hendrick has handed down a decision to the effect that all watchers at the polls must be voters, and residents of the State, which, unless reversed, establishes a precedent for future elections.

Washington, Nov. 5.—The signal corps aviators, Lieutenant Laum and Humphreys, met with their first aerial accident early today at the government's aerodrome in College Park, Md. The engine balked and while they were attempting a landing the left wing of the machine scraped the ground. This threw the aeroplane off its balance and the right wing crashed into the earth. Neither passenger was hurt but the main plane was badly damaged and the right braces attached to the elevating plane were broken.
