A "GOLDEN RULE" POLICE CHIEF

How the Head of Cleveland's Police Department Has Inaugurated a Successful Plan for Lessening the Arrests in His City

FRED KOHLER, Chief of Police, Cleveland, Ohio

(Chief Kohler's "common sense policy" has reduced the arrests from drunkenness alone from 49,738 in 1905, 1906 and 1907, an average of over 16,500 a year to 3,592 for 1908)

On various occasions since the inception of our common sense or so-called "Golden Rule Policy" in the Police Department of the City of Cleveland on January 1st, 1908, I have been asked by various interests just what our policy is and what it does for the people of this community.

The golden rule policy adds character to the force and gets away from the old idea, that the police are brutes, and simply persecute people. It is a newer and better justice. It never catches to crime or criminals.

Through the "golden rule" plan, we have reduced the arrests for intoxication alone, from 49,738 during the years 1905, 1906 and 1907, under the old and inefficient method of making arrests, to an average of over 16,500 per year, and the arrests were growing larger in each year to 3,592 for 1908 and still lower in 1909, the total for nine months up to October 1st being but 787.

Through years of study and observations we were thoroughly familiar with the fact that the most effective and humane methods of making wholesale arrests in first and minor violations, as in cases of intoxication, not only reduce the number of arrests, but also reduce the number of second offenders.

With the reduction of arrests of minor or first offenders, we have also increased the arrests of real criminals and those who make their living by criminal means and practices, until now we have less actual crime committed in this city than for a great many years previous to the adoption of our policy.

Who could it possibly benefit if we should take money in the way of a fine from a poor unfortunate, who has violated some minor law or ordinance, with no intent to injure the property or person of another?
