HYPNOTIST WHOSE SPELL CAUSED SUBJECT'S DEATH



Those persons who are interested in the subject of hypnotism, including such scientists as Professor Quackenbush, are deeply concerned over a recent tragedy at Somerville, N. J., which resulted in the death of Robert Simpson while he was acting as a subject for "Professor" Arthur Everton, a strolling hypnotist. Simpson had been in Everton's employ for several weeks and nightly was placed in a hypnotic state by Everton during the progress of their stage performances. On one occasion the subject remained in the trance twenty-four hours and was easily revived by the professor. At the Somerville theatre, however, Everton was unable to revive the man, and when physicians were called they pronounced Simpson dead. Everton is in jail on a charge of manslaughter.

WOULD PURIFY STATE POLITICS

Torrington, Nov. 12.—The forty-third annual meeting of the conference of Congregational churches of Connecticut closed here yesterday after holding sessions for three days. The morning was taken up with several addresses and papers. There was some discussion informally of the resolution passed, committing the clergy of the denomination to an effort to purify politics in the state. This resolution has caused a great deal of comment and it was as follows: "In view of the large importance to the moral interests of Connecticut of the moral legislation for which we must look to the next general assembly, and particularly of the approaching election to the United States senatorship,Resolved, that this conference urge on its members the duty of doing their utmost to arouse the moral sentiments of their several towns in favor of the choice of the legislators of such characters as will give to our own state efficient laws conservative of morals, and a United States senator who shall represent these ideals of personal and political integrity for which Connecticut historically stands.

"And further, we instruct our committee on Sunday observance and moral legislation to do all that they can legitimately to this end."
