WOMAN RETIRED IN GOOD HEALTH COUGHED AND DIED

Stamford, Nov. 12.—Mrs. Rooney, wife of Martin Rooney of 11 East Meadow street, aged 28 years, expired suddenly at her home about 11:45 last night after having been ill but fifteen minutes. Returning from calling on a neighbor across the street, Mrs. Rooney retired about 10 p. m., apparently in the best of health. Towards midnight she was seized with a violent attack of coughing and before she could be summoned she passed away. Death was due to heart trouble brought on by the coughing, according to the report of Dr. Sherrill, the coroner's medical examiner who investigated the death. Besides her husband Mrs. Rooney leaves four daughters and two sons.

MANY KILLED IN MOB ATTACK

(Special from United Press.) Paris, Nov. 12.—A despatch from Rome to Fourmiers News Agency says that many were killed in an attempt by a mob to invade the Palais National Chamber to-day. The mob, which included scores of women, made the attack with stones and knives. Troops on guard about the chamber charged the mob and began firing in volleys. Many were killed, the despatch says, among them three women and scores were wounded on both sides. The cause of the disturbance is not made plain.


TAFT AND BUCKINGHAM AT HARTFORD

Our President and Our Mayor at Big Celebration

(Special from United Press.) Hartford, Nov. 12.—On the heels of the celebration in Middletown attending the installation of President Shantlin of Wesleyan, was the ceremony of dedicating the magnificent new state armory and arsenal of the First Regiment, Connecticut National Guard, this afternoon. The ceremony began at 3 o'clock with the assembly of all those participating in the event, followed by a monster parade. The doors of the new armory opened at 5:30 for the commencement of the exercises proper. Following the arrival of President Taft at 6:10, Ex-Governor Henry Roberts, chairman of the armory committee will deliver an address of presentation, the new structure being received officially on behalf of the state by Governor Weeks. At 8:30 to-night the grand reception and ball which President Taft will attend the private seance that Mme. Paladino gives and will endeavor in every possible way to discover whether she is a trickster or is actually in control of some supernatural power. Mme. Paladino is an undersized woman about fifty years of age. Her seances have been attended by the more noted scientists of the old world, and none has been able to solve the secret of her powers.


