THE LOCAL REPUBLICAN INSURGENTS

Although the new Primary law, passed by the General Assembly at its last session, provides for the disciplining of voters who are not in good faith members of the party on whose enrollment list their names appear, it is not at all probable that the penalty provided will be enforced against the Republicans who voted for Buckingham at the recent election.

The law is obviously intended to punish members of one party who register in the enrollment list of the other in order to vote in its primaries. It was as obviously not intended to punish a man for voting as he believes right, but that it can be so twisted as to serve the purposes of machine rule is equally clear.

Senator Aldrich and Speaker Cannon would probably be greatly pleased if they could apply this Connecticut primary law to the cases of the insurgent Republican members of Congress from the Middle West.
