### WHOOPIING COUGH

(State Board of Health.) Several times of late, advice has been sought from this office as to whether any attempt should be made to control whooping cough by quarantine. The town health regulations require that this disease be reported and children suffering with it be excluded from school, but it is not one of the diseases requiring quarantine and the attempt is seldom made to prevent children having it from running about the streets infecting others. In Connecticut whooping cough causes more deaths than either measles or scarlet fever and about one half as many as diphtheria, besides being recognized as one of the predisposing causes of tuberculosis. It is not always as trivial a disorder as it is sometimes regarded. The susceptibility to the disease diminishes with advancing age and beyond the age of five the mortality is very slight, therefore young children especially should be carefully guarded from exposure to infection. It is suggested by contact or close association with the sick and is rarely conveyed by a third person, so that to confine a child on his own premises is usually sufficient to prevent his spreading the disease. When it has become epidemic in a town, it is doubtful whether quarantine will do very much good, but in small communities where it is possible to get hold of the first case much can be accomplished by such measures and these ought always to be adopted.
