CONTRACTOR KILLS WIFE BEATS DOWN HER MOTHER AND SLASHES OWN THROAT

Patrick H. Rafferty in His Prosperity Plunged Into Dissipation and Because His Wife Preferred to Live With Her Folks He Vented His Violent Rage in Today's Awful Tragedy.

(Special from United Press.) New York, Nov. 30.—In an outburst of violent rage Patrick H. Rafferty, a contracting bricklayer, to-day killed his wife, Margaret, mortally injured his aged mother-in-law, Mrs. Margaret Kelly, his brother-in-law, Frank Ohland, and his 5-year-old boy. The fatal happened at Mrs. Kelly's home in Brooklyn and after Rafferty had been taken to the station house it was necessary to put him in a straight-jacket to prevent him injuring himself.

he caught her and slashed her throat, almost cutting her head off. His mother-in-law rushed into the room and followed him into the kitchen screaming. He picked up a mop and beat her down with it, crushing her skull and left her unconscious. The little Ohland boy ran to help his grandmother and was felled with a blow in the face. His father, Frank Ohland, rushed in on the instant and the latter slashed him about the face and hands and then attacked him with fists and feet. Ohland fled to save his life while neighbors who had been alarmed by the screaming summoned the police.

Rafferty is 45 years old and was married three years ago to Margaret Kelly, many years his junior. The two took up their home at Mrs. Rafferty's mother, where her son-in-law, Frank Ohland, and his 5-year-old boy were boarding. Rafferty was prosperous and it is alleged he plunged into dissipation. He returned home early to-day, having been drinking and renewed his demand that his wife go with him and help prepare a home of their own. She refused saying: "You drink too much and I cannot trust you. I intend staying with mother."
