Madison Square Garden Will Stay For Another Year

Prospective Leasing of Big Arena to the Ringing Circus For Five Years Has Fallen Through

Madison Square Garden passed yesterday out of the hands of the company which has controlled it since it was opened in 1890 as New York's great amusement headquarters.

The prospective leasing of the Garden to the Ringing Circus for five years has fallen through, but the new owners will conduct the Garden during the current year on the same terms as the old owners.

The Ringing Circus has already leased the Garden for the greater part of March, and promoters of other exhibits such as have formerly been held there are to have transferred to the circus their regular shows there during the coming months.

The new owners paid about \$3,000 for the property, which takes up the entire block between Fourth and Madison avenues and Twenty-sixth and Twenty-seventh streets.

INCREASING POWER PLANT. Preparations Under Way For Bridgeport Trolley Line.

(Danbury News, Feb. 14.) Extensive improvements are being made in the power plant of the Danbury and Bethel Street Railway Co. are designed to increase the efficiency of the plant.
