CORNER FOR COOKS

BAKED SALMON WIGGLE.

A good supper dish—One can of salmon, one-half can of peas, butter size of an egg, salt and pepper, milk sauce. Bake about one-half hour.

SUGAR COOKIES. Two cups of sugar, one cup of butter, three-fourths of a cup of milk, two of vanilla, two teaspoons of baking powder.

VEAL RAGOUT. Grease a pan with 1/2 large tablespoonful of butter. Add three finely chopped onions and fry slowly until brown.

MAPLE MOUSSE. Mix two cupfuls heavy cream and three-fourths cupful maple syrup. Whip until thick and add one cupful chopped nuts.

CHEESE SALAD. Wash and clean a head of crisp lettuce. Quarter and add plenty grated American cheese.

WATERMELON CAKE. Whites of six eggs, two cups of white sugar, one cup of butter, one cup of sweet milk, four even cups of flour, two teaspoons of baking powder.
