
IF THEY GO TO PICTURE SHOWS.

CORNER FOR COOKS

CHOCOLATE FILLING FOR LAYER CAKES. One cup of grated sweet chocolate, one-half cup of milk, one-half cup of sugar. Boil 15 minutes. Flavor lightly with vanilla and spread white hot between the layers and on top of the cake.

CARAMEL CAKE.

Mix one cup butter, two cups sugar, a scant cup milk, 1-2 cups flour, one cup cornstarch, whites of seven eggs, three teaspoons baking powder in flour. Bake in a long pan.

SPICE CAKE.

One and one-fourth cups sugar, one-half cup shortening, one egg, little salt, one cup sour milk, one teaspoon soda, one cup chopped raisins, one teaspoon each of cinnamon, allspice and cloves, flour enough to thicken.

GRAHAM BREAD.

Two cups each graham, white flour and water, one-half cup sugar, one teaspoon salt, 1-2 yeast cake. Dissolve the yeast in two cups of water, no more. Mix with dry ingredients thoroughly.

UNCOOKED CHOW CHOW.

Four quarts green tomatoes, one quart green peppers, one pint onions, all chopped fine; 1-2 cups salt, 1-2 pint mustard, one cup vinegar, one teaspoon onion powder, one teaspoon cayenne, one quart vinegar, scalded and poured over all. To be kept in a stone jar. Will be ready for use in a few days.
