**WILLIAM WALDO HYDE, NOTED LAWYER, DEAD**

Hartford, Oct. 30.—William Waldo Hyde, former mayor of Hartford, and one of the distinguished lawyers of the state, died at a private hospital this morning. Mr. Hyde had been ill since Monday with intestinal trouble to which he was subject. It failed to respond to the usual treatment and on Friday evening an operation was deemed urgently necessary. This was performed and relieved the trouble but at an early hour this morning he was seized with cerebral hemorrhage, becoming unconscious. Death came a few hours later.
