AN APPEAL IN BEHALF OF HORSE

Humane Society Sums Up Winter Conditions.

With the coming of the real winter, the Connecticut Humane Society is making, as usual, an appeal in behalf of the horse, summing up the situation in this way:

The early icy days of winter never fail to result in the loss of many horses by falling on slippery streets. Jack Frost surprises both those in charge of the streets and the teamsters...

Many persons find fault with the city authorities for not having smooth pavements. This does not help the matter. The city or town cannot be held liable for damages in general when horses fall on the streets.

On the other hand the responsibility in the use of slippery streets rests in large measure with horse owners and teamsters.

The society is sending out a leaflet giving "Cold Weather Suggestions for the Treatment of Horses," as follows: Warm the bits a little on freezing mornings.

Be careful about exposing him when overheated. Blanket him when he stands in the cold. Have his shoes sharpened when the streets are slippery.

Take no risks of injury to him in skating over asphalt. On icy mornings carry some sand for emergencies.

Load lighter when snow blocks the streets. Do a little shoveling and help your horse. Attempt no hard pulls up steep or slippery inclines.

Horses draw and keep their balance better unchecked. Give him frequent rests on snowy roads. Help your horse with a little axle grease.

Rub him down when he comes in wet. Feed carefully and well during the winter. Blanket and bed him sufficiently on cold nights.

Send for a veterinarian before it is too late. Keep your temper and save your horse. These humane suggestions are made in the interest of the horse, but do not forget that he is your property and the value of many horses is depreciated by their treatment in wintry weather.

Another item in the society's appeal literature is a postal card, which reads as follows: Save your horses from strain on sprain on icy pavements by keeping them well sharpened or making them a present of a set of chain overshoes...
