Will Surely Have Ticket in Field, Says George W. Perkins—Roosevelt's Name is Foremost in Declaration of Presidential Nominees—Endorsement of Republican Candidate Not Probable, is Belief of Many Progressives.

Chicago, Jan. 11.—With the arrival of the vanguard of the Progressive National Committee this city awoke to the fact that this is a Presidential election year and that from now on and until the holding of the Republican and Progressive National conventions next June politics will hold the center of the stage with the European war.

White George W. Perkins declared emphatically that the Progressives have a ticket in the field, the statement was construed as meaning that the Progressives would endorse a ticket, either that of the Republicans or their own.

Perkins is noncommittal. Mr. Perkins was conservative in his statements, refusing to express any opinion as to the merits of the Progressive National convention, the place, or its action regarding the endorsement of any possible candidate of any other party.
