DEPARTMENT BUILDS BRIDGES

Some of the most interesting work which the highway commissioner has had on his hands since the adjournment of the legislature is the reconstruction of unsafe bridges on trunk line highways.

550,000 AVAILABLE

The act made an appropriation of \$200,000 to pay the state's share of bridge building and with the towns and trolley companies paying a large share of the cost the department has approximately \$550,000 to expend in reconstructing bridges during the two years.

New Bridge Work Planned

For the coming year, the department has plans for the reconstruction of still more bridges. Some are now under way or in process of completion and others will be commenced with the warm weather.

Big Bridges Building

At the present time a bridge is being constructed in the town of Westport of which the total cost to town, county and state will be \$160,000.

One In Windsor

A new bridge is planned to be built over the Farmington river at Windsor to replace the covered wooden bridge which has long been a menace to autoists traveling on the west side of the river.

To Eliminate Death-Trap

The Windsor death trap, a fearsome place, is also to be eliminated at a cost of \$100,000, half of which is to be paid by the state and the balance by the town of Windsor.

In addition to this big construction work, many small bridges are being built in various towns of the state.

One of the most important duties which faces the highway department this summer is the preparation for the general assembly of 1917 of data on the reconstruction of the railroad bridges across the Thames river.

This sum is to be divided into the following items: Maintenance and oiling \$650,000; Purchase of equipment \$500,000; Overhead and administration \$3,000; Signs and posting \$5,000; Reconstruction and permanent surfacing of roads already built \$300,000.

This leaves a balance of about \$90,000 for contingencies.

The largest item in the highway budget for the year is the permanent surfacing of roads which have already been constructed.

There is also the possible construction of a one and one-half mile piece through Bolton, known as the Bolton North road.

In Norwalk, in co-operation with the town, a very dangerous corner on Arden street will be eliminated.

Detail of the concrete, bituminous macadam and other types of permanent work showing towns in which the work was done.

Recapitulation. Total new construction \$261,093.52; State aid \$20,000.00; Total reconstruction \$281,093.52.

Total maintenance: Trunk line \$85,446.48; State aid \$18,042.86; Total \$103,489.34.

Total miles of construction and reconstruction 163.07. Total miles maintained, 1,386.07.

The total mileage of concrete and reinforced concrete road built is 16.95 miles, of which 4.31 miles represent reconstruction of old roads.

There was a total of 8.77 miles of bituminous concrete, of which 6.26 miles represented resurfacing of old roads.
