K. OF C. HOLDING STATE CONVENTION

Derby, Conn., May 9.—With more than 150 delegates in attendance, the annual state convention of the Knights of Columbus was held here today. Preceding the opening the delegates attended services at St. Mary's Roman Catholic church, when high mass was solemnized by Rev. Dr. R. F. Fitzgerald, the pastor.

presided at the convention sessions and following an address by Mayor George P. Sullivan, and by Representatives of the local council the delegates settled down to the transaction of business which included presentation of reports and election of officers for the ensuing term, and five delegates to the national convention. Reports of the secretary and the treasurer showed a total membership of 10,698, an increase during the year of 455 and a balance on hand of \$1,968.90.
