DAILEY REJOINS RUNNING MATE IN RANKS OF POLICE

Connecticut Co. Loses Both Members of Local Trolley Crew.

The dreams of one of the crews of the Connecticut Co.'s trolley cars were realized last evening when Patrick Dailey, 33 years of age, a conductor, living at 91 Wells street, was appointed to the police department to succeed James E. Heneghan, one of the 70 recently appointed, who tendered his resignation.

Dailey was the conductor on one of the cars of which Patrick O'Neill was motorman. Both had aspirations to serve the city as guardians of the law, both were certain that they would be appointed with the batch of 70 named May 15. But the plans miscarried and Dailey did not receive his appointment.

There was much disappointment because the two "Pats" were not both among the select for O'Neill had been appointed and Dailey was left out in the cold.

Last evening Heneghan sent in his resignation because his wife is ill and did not want him to be away at night. Dailey was asked to succeed him and after President John C. Stanley had given him the oath, Commissioner Lyddy took him up to the city court room to introduce him to the other appointees, who had gathered for their first lesson in police work. Great was the joy of Dailey and O'Neill when they held a reunion after the lesson was over.

Charges were preferred against Policeman Alexander Coughlin by Michael Gerrity of 1175 North avenue for using abusive language to him and his wife on March 11. Both families reside in the same house and had a quarrel which resulted in Coughlin arresting Gerrity, but the case was nolle in the city court. The charges were referred to the committee on discipline.

Frank T. Lydders of 60 North avenue was appointed a special policeman and will do duty at the Ashcroft Manufacturing Co.

A report from Electrician Thomas Williams was received suggesting that some old electrical apparatus be disposed of to the Gamewell Co. and certain new appliances obtained. The matter was referred to Commissioner Lyddy with power to act.

SEVEN VOLUNTEER LIFE SAVERS WILL ACT IN FAIRFIELD

Arrangements have been completed by the officers of the United States Volunteer Life Saving corps stationed at the public bathing house at Seaside park for the establishment of a subdivision at Fairfield beach and beginning June 15, seven men will be

detached to patrol the beach and watch out for the bathers. Headquarters will be established in the bathing pavilion conducted by Flint and Acker and already the equipment for the station has been ordered. The station will be equipped with a lung motor, two boats and the necessary first aid equipment and bathers at the beach will appreciate the efforts of the corps in doing the volunteer work to minimize the danger of accident.

The members of the corps who have been selected to do duty at the beach are Junior Lieutenant Somerville, Quartermaster De Champs, Lieutenant Surgeon Brown, and Surfmen Nichols, Meyers, Hungerford and Patterson.
