"ROLLING STONES" NEXT WEEK.

Two youthful crooks of a new and engaging sort are the heroes of "Rolling Stones," the new Edgar Selwyn comedy that will be presented here next week at the Lyric theatre. About these happy-go-lucky young men, Mr. Selwyn has written one of the breeziest crook plays that has been seen for many a day. A melo-dramatic comedy is what the author calls his latest work and in four lively acts he tells the story of how two Chicago youths who are down on their luck, penniless and starving, finally land on easy street by methods that are not exactly the kind taught by the Ethical Culture society. Buck Ryder, the elder of the boys, finds himself face to face with a board bill of rather large dimensions and being unable to meet the landlady's demand, is moved to the sidewalk. Desperate conditions call for desperate actions and Buck turns highwayman and chooses for his victim a young man who happens to be in a worse plight than he is himself. Together they decide to pool fortunes and Buck takes the other unfortunate back to the boarding house and presents him as Jericho Braden, a young man from the west who has fallen heir to a large candy business. The real Braden is thought to have lost his life in a railroad accident, so Dave Fulton easily passes muster as the lucky heir. The two "Rolling Stones" obtain possession of the business and with it fall heir to a series of adventures that finally result in building up the business to huge proportions; that brings sweethearts to both boys from most unexpected directions, and further, almost lands them both in jail. However, their native wit comes to their rescue and they manage to squeeze through a very tight situation when they are surprised in front of the company's safe late at night by the real Braden accompanied by a burglar and the youthful heroes have a most exciting time with the police and difficulty in explaining how they got there, but like the clever young men that they are, they rise to the occasion and prove worthy of the positions they eventually win in the company they tried to steal. When the final curtain falls one can feel assured that the charming young girls who have given themselves to Buck and Dave, will prove more than sufficient to keep the "Rolling Stones" from gathering the moss in the manner they had originally intended. That sterling character actor, Geo. F. Smithfield, will be seen in the breezy part

of "Dave Fulton," also an admirable company including Esther Welty, Joe J. Kelly, June Moore, Earl Yeager, Jean McAlpin, Chas. Mylott, Jos. Cusack, Harry B. McGrane, Marie Resley and others. 
PLAZA.
